The kit was presented to the Director of Medical Services Dr. Shariff by KPC Managing Director Mr. Selest Kilinda at the Ministry of Health headquarters. KPC will further meet the cost of training the staff at the Government laboratories.

Mr. Kilinda said that KPC offered to donate the kit for use not only to assist in identifying the Sinai victims but also to boost the country's technology in carrying out other criminal investigations.

Dr. Shariff thanked KPC for the donation in view of the challenges the Government has faced in identifying the Sinai victims and other tragedies of the same magnitude.

He said the newly acquired technology will also be very useful in forensic cases such as rape and the rising spate of paternity test.
